

Introductory Notes

This is a sample divination with the Sacred Geometry Oracle, to give you an idea of the kind of readings I do at TheHiddenThings.com, and the kind of report you can expect after your reading.

It features a job-related question, but of course I also field requests from most other areas of human life: issues related to family, kids, relationships, friendships, ...; questions about personal or spiritual development, about one's path or about a difficult decision, requests for advice of any sorts, or requests to find out how certain things will be in the future.

(I'm sure there are other topics which I've forgotten, so please don't let the fact that your question isn't listed here keep you from reaching out to me!)

Since people do readings or divinations in all ways and forms, and in all kinds of different styles, formats, lengths, and depths, I found it helpful to offer a sample so first-time clients will know what they are getting into. ;-)

Most of my readings require between 90 minutes and two hours. During that time, I usually ask the Oracle between half a dozen and a dozen questions, and draw a card for each of them.

With 11 cards, the sample reading was on the longer side. This isn't done to impress you, but because this particular reading required it. I always follow my intuition and the Oracle's guidance (there has been more than one instance where the Oracle insisted quite emphatically that I should draw another card, because there still was something it wanted to say!), and I always ask the questions which seem the most helpful or important to the client.

In the end, I don't just want you to get an answer, but an answer which is helpful. If I can achieve that with five cards, it's fine - and if it takes 12 cards, that's fine, too. (Same goes for the length of the pdf file - I type out what I feel should be said, however long or short that might be).

Btw, the email you will get from me will also include a photo of the relevant cards, spread out as they were at the end of the reading. I didn't include such a photo here, simply because I have no idea if that would violate anyone's copyright – but I trust the sample is informative without it, too.

By now you might be wondering: **Has the sample reading been a real reading?**

The answer is: Well, yes and no.

No, it wasn't a reading I've done for a client. (I value your privacy, and even posting a client reading anonymously just wouldn't be right.)

But yes, it was a real reading nonetheless. Let me explain:

In order to "generate" this sample reading, I came up with the name of a fictional person, and with his fictional request, which is something a client might well have asked.

I then approached the Oracle and respectfully told it that I wanted to generate such a sample to showcase the readings we are doing together, so that people can make an informed decision on whether to book a divination or not. I asked it to fill in the blanks and help me generate a meaningful and characteristic reading and report.

As expected, the Oracle rose up to the occasion (and for what it's worth, it seemed to have a lot of fun...). It even filled in some blanks about my fictional character's background which clients usually tend to tell me in their emails, but which I had to figure out myself during the reading. As I said, it did have fun. ;-)

Anyway, that's the origin of this reading. It's not "real", but it's "real" - this is exactly how I would have done the same divination, under the same circumstances, if Neil would have sent me this request as a client. And without further ado, here we go...

Sacred Geometry Oracle - **SAMPLE**

Reading for “Neil”

February 23, 2023

A few notes in advance

Please keep in mind that while the oracle might be infallible, I am far from it. You should regard the result of my divination within the larger context, and always use your common sense and take other information into account before deciding on the best course of action.

As I don't have much background information about your personal situation, I'm doing my best to give an intuitive interpretation of the results, but also to explain the meaning of some cards in a general way - they might give you additional pointers that I didn't pick up in my interpretation of the cards.

Summary

You wanted to know if you should stick with your old job in this company, even though it doesn't seem to lead any further, or if it would be better for you to attempt a career change.

In summary, the Oracle seems to think that the career change would be your best option, but it warned you about a potential pitfall you should avoid when you pursue that path. It also had a few interesting things to say about your current job, your current company, and similar jobs at other companies, and about your own role in all this, plus some final advice for you.

The Divination

(My questions and the Oracle's answers are numbered so I can reference them in the text. For your convenience, I've included the numbers and names of the cards I drew from the Oracle, and also the keywords which are assigned to them. Please don't be put off by any of these keywords - some sound a lot worse than the actual meaning of the card really is. I will give you detailed interpretations below each result. "Reversed" means a card which was pulled upside down.)

I first wanted to get a feeling for the situation, and thus asked about the roles which the various forces are playing:

1. Neil – 15. The Tetrahedron – Energy
2. Your existing job – 12. The Square (reversed) – Inertia
3. The company you're currently working for – 31. The Sphere – Infinity

The Tetrahedron (1.) tells us that there is plenty of energy present in a situation, and that it can be used to achieve your goals, as long as you handle it carefully.

With this card, the Oracle tells us that you yourself would have the power to change your situation, if you so wish – you would just need to do it.

The Square reversed (2.) talks about being stuck in a rut, about doing the same things over and over.

It seems that you have stopped exploring new options with regards to your existing job. Maybe there would be ways to make it more interesting, more demanding, or more promising? But unless you change something and explore new options, nothing much is going to come out of it.

This ties right in with 1. - the Oracle seems to think that it is in large parts up to you that your current job has gotten monotonous and isn't leading anywhere, and that it would be well within your power to change that if you so want.

The Sphere (3.) tells us about limitless possibilities, possibilities which might be greater than we can even imagine at this point.

The fact that the Oracle chose this card to represent the company you're presently working for also stressed the fact that there would have been (and probably still are) possibilities for further development for you right there, in this company, if only you'd choose to make use of them.

Overall, with these three cards, the Oracle quite clearly points out the fact that if you should decide to attempt a change right where you are, there wouldn't be much holding you back. In a way, the current stagnation is due to your own choices and actions (or non-actions).

I then asked for the most obvious other choices:

- 4. A different job in the same company as before – 2. The Point – Beginning*
- 5. A similar job as before, but in a different company – 33. The Human Canon – Unity*
- 6. A completely different job/career path elsewhere – 5. The Ellipse – Flow*

The Point (4.) stresses that it's time to move out of the planning stage into the real world, it's time to take action and actually make a beginning.

In relation to the question (and with 1. and 3. in mind), here the Oracle is telling you that such a job would be possible, but it would require you to take action in order to get there, it won't show up all by itself.

The Human Canon (5.) reminds us that we are the most powerful force shaping our own universe and especially what we experience.

If you should decide to pursue a similar job, but in a different company, you would still be the same old "you" as before. As long as you don't attempt to change anything within you, in your thoughts, emotions, actions, you will still get to experience the same things. I.e. just switching companies

wouldn't make the current job (or a similar one) any more interesting or challenging, and it wouldn't necessarily lead to any further-leading career options if you don't take action yourself to pursue them.

The Ellipse (6.) tells us that things are not only in motion, but in their natural flow. If you can manage to flow with them (instead of pursuing your own ideas and habits), you can get quite far. This is usually a promising sign if you can follow the natural flow of things.

Overall, of the four options (staying with your job, new job with old employer, old job with new employer, or full-on career change), I feel that this is the most promising. A career change would follow the natural flow of things – but remember that it would require you to follow that flow, even if things might feel uncomfortable at times, or if they wouldn't flow according to your own plans.

However, if you followed one of the other paths, you also wouldn't get much further than now unless you are prepared to leave your comfort zone and accept change, especially change within yourself and related to your own actions, habits, thoughts and emotions.

Either way, with cards 1. to 6., the Oracle is gently telling you that if you want things to change, you'll have to be part of that change in some way.

But just because 6. sounds like the easiest and maybe the least challenging option doesn't mean it will also give you the best overall outcome. I thus explicitly asked about the results of all of the potential new paths:

- 7. *Result if Neil pursues 4. - 20. Gnomonic Expansion (reversed) – Excess*
- 8. *Result if Neil pursues 5. - 24. Progression of Roots (reversed) – Unexpectedness*
- 9. *Result if Neil pursues 6. - 25. Discontinuous Proportion (reversed) – Dependence*

Gnomonic Expansion reversed (7.) talks about too much of something good, about taking something good too far.

Here the Oracle is suggesting that just because your experience with the company itself (even if not with your current job) so far has been good, a new job with them would be taking things too far. If you move to expand things with them, that would lead too far, and you wouldn't be able to achieve the good results which you are hoping for, based on prior experiences.

Progression of Roots reversed (8.) tells us that unexpected things might happen, and things might not go according to plan, or according to our “reasonable” expectations.

If you take a similar job, but with a different company, the outcome will be highly unpredictable, and potentially not what you intended. Taken together with 5., I take it that the results of this move would to some extent depend on your own actions, as they will shape your experiences in this case, but that there might also be elements of (potentially unwelcome) surprise. Note that this card doesn't necessarily suggest a complete failure or disaster, it could also just indicate smaller unexpected developments or hurdles, but overall it's not very promising.

Discontinuous Proportion reversed (9.) is an interesting card. It talks about being dependent on somebody else or on outside factors, but these are artificial or imagined dependencies. The element it represents might assume that it has much less power or control over the situation than it actually has, or that it is dependent on other people's actions, or on outside developments.

With this card, the Oracle reminds you again that what happens in your job situation is to a large extent up to you – you have all the power to achieve the changes you wish (1.). And while you would be well advised to follow the flow if you pursue a career change, that is not the same as sitting there passively and waiting for things to happen on their own before you can take action, or before you can pursue a new career.

I.e. a careful balance is required here: On the one hand, you need to take action, e.g. contact companies, talk to people, research new career options, maybe try them out. But on the other hand, you need to be very attentive to the natural flow of things, and to how things develop. If (maybe through your actions) any unexpected doors should open up for you, it might be smart to check them out and then maybe even step through them.

From all the options so far, the Oracle clearly seems to be in favour of the career change – but with the caveats lined out above. For completeness sake, I also drew another card about your current job, but incorporated the Oracle's advice from above (asking about the results of your current job as it is seemed pointless, since you aren't happy with it to begin with):

10. Result if Neil pursues his current job, but takes action and is open to change/doing things differently – 6. The Vesica Piscis (reversed) – Encounter

The Vesica Piscis reversed reminds us that other people have their own plans, needs and expectations, and that you might have some rather unpleasant encounters with these people.

In the context of the question, this suggest that if you start changing things in and around your existing job, not everybody will be happy about it. Humans are creatures of habit, and not everybody will appreciate it if e.g. you suddenly start to take on a more active role, or take over more responsibility. If you do that, you will run against other people's personal limits.

I then pulled one final card for you:

11. Any further advice for Neil? - 11. Quadrature of the Circle – Integration

Quadrature of the Circle tells us that while there are a lot of small things to take care of, now is the time to pull them all together and focus on the big picture, and no longer on the small details. It is also a reminder that certain things will take care of themselves if we just let them and stop worrying.

With regards to the question, this is twofold advice: First, the Oracle suggest that when you move forward, you sort out the big picture first (How do you want to work? What are you willing to change or to contribute in order to get there?), and then figure out the details. And secondly, it

gently reminds you that you might have developed a tendency to overthinking or over-worrying, and that this isn't necessarily productive, and might even lead to stressful inaction.

Overall, the Oracle has been pretty clear in its advice to you: It suggests a career change (including not just a new job, but a completely different career path, with a new employer or potentially also self-employed) as the most promising way forward – but it also did remind you that you will need to follow the flow and let go of some of your own ideas in order to achieve what you wish for (6.).

It also reminded you that you have the power to take action (1.) and to shape your own universe even if you should decide to stay in your current job or something similar (5.). Your current feeling of being stuck in this job is largely due to the fact that you haven't pursued the necessary change, but instead have simply continued with things as they are (2., 3.). However, if you should decide to stay in this job and approach things in a different, more productive way, be prepared for pushback from other people (10.). And pursuing a similar job elsewhere might lead to unexpected and potentially unwelcome results (8.), and thus doesn't seem as promising as the career change.

Your current employer is mostly not the source of your current discontent and might offer you lots of other opportunities (3.), but if you push for a different job there, you will most likely not get as much good out of it as your current job initially gave you (7.) - plus there is the fact that it would also require you to take specific action and will thus to some extent also lead you out of your comfort zone (4.).

However, a certain amount of change and of “leaving your comfort zone” will be necessary if you decide for the career change, too – the Oracle clearly pointed out the danger that you might make yourself dependent on outside factors or on other people and their actions, where, again, the power to act is actually within yourself (9.).

This also ties in with the last card, the Oracle's overall advice for your future job/career path (11.): You should stop over-worrying and overthinking, and instead focus on the big picture (what do you really want to achieve?) and then take focused action to get there, even if that might be uncomfortable at the beginning. Remember that a lot of the things we tend to worry about in our lives quite miraculously take care of themselves...

A final note:

I hope this sample gave you a clear picture of what you can expect from my Sacred Geometry Oracle divinations – and of course, I hope you liked it... :-)
